WHEREAS, the Federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARP) initial distribution has been received by the Town of Woodfin in the amount of \$1,070,345.37 and the second and final installment is anticipated approximately twelve months later; for a total of \$2,140,690.73, and

WHEREAS, in accordance with applicable provisions of the North Carolina Local Government Budget and Fiscal Control Act; and

WHEREAS, the Budget Officer and the Town of Woodfin Board of Commissioners wish to establish a Grant Project Budget as outlined below.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE WOODFIN BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS THAT:

Section 1: The grant project budget listed below for the ARP Special Revenue Fund

(Fund 31) is hereby adopted.

1. Appropriation of the American Recovery Plan Act revenue of \$2,140,690.73. \$1,070,345.37 of which was received in July of 2021 and the balance is expected to be deposited in June of 2022.

2. \$2,140,690.73: Provide budget appropriation for spending of the ARPA funds in line with community priorities to support strong policy, education, stormwater infrastructure and environmental support needs, efficient waste collection, and town hall air quality and signage needs.

Notes on the Preliminary Cost Estimate (First Phase)

The first phase of the Riverside Expansion was designed to accommodate the Town of Woodfin's available funds at the time of the creation of this master plan document. All cost estimates are based on the best available data at the time of creation. Such data includes similar park bids and construction estimates from contractors.

This is a 30% level cost estimate only provided as part of the Master Planning effort. The cost estimats should be updated and refined as part of the development of the Construction Documents.

These cost estimates do not include removing the remnants of the old bridge pilings as this is anticipated to be part of the Wave project.

Summary:

Over the past several months, Town Administrator, Eric Hardy, solicited input from the Board, Staff and Citizens regarding the Town's priorities in spending the American Recovery funds that will total \$2,140,690.73. A summary of the spending priorities established were presented to the Board at the July 20, 2021, Board meeting for discussion and direction from the Board. The attached Budget Ordinance represents management's understanding of Board's spending priorities for the ARP funds.

Process and Timeline:

Approval of the SRP Special Revenue Fund Budget Ordinance will establish an initial budget for the life of the grant. Any amendment or change in spending authorization for the ARP funds will require Board approval. ARP legislation indicates that local governments have until December 31, 2024, to obligate the ARP monies and until December 31, 2026, to expend all the funds.

Budget Impact:

This Budget Ordinance is for a multi-year grant with at total estimated budget of \$2,140,690.73.

Recommendation/Next Steps:

Staff recommends approval of the Budget Ordinance.
