**Executive Session** – The Board of Aldermen will adjourn to private chambers to discuss legal, contractual or similar matters protected by state statute.

**New Business**

1. Swearing in Ceremony for Recently Elected Officials.

**Judge Alan Thornburg will arrive to swear in the recently elected officials. If you would like to bring a particular family member to hold the Bible or a family Bible please do so. If you would prefer not to use your own Bible you may use the Town's.**

2. Consideration of an Ordinance Prohibiting the Possession of Concealed Weapons on or about the Public Buildings and Parks of the Town of Woodfin.

**Recent actions by the General Assembly have revoked the Town's previously existing restrictions on carrying concealed weapons at Woodfin's playgrounds, parks, recreational facilities and public buildings. Should the Board wish to restrict the carrying of concealed weapons at our municipal facilities then it will be necessary to adopt an ordinance specifically restricting their possession on these properties.**

**I have prepared an ordinance that I believe will accomplish this goal should the Board wish to keep these restrictions in place. Chief Holloman has communicated to me his belief that keeping these restrictions in areas likely to draw high concentrations of small children is in the best interest of the community. In discussing this**

**matter with some other constituents I have heard varying opinions. I would anticipate that at least one member of the public will be in attendance to advocate against adopting such a regulation.**

3. Public Hearing on a Petition to Declare an Open and Public Road.
4. Consideration of a Resolution Declaring an Open and Public Road.

**These two matters are a public hearing and resolution that revolve around the issue of whether the Board should accept Standing Wood Drive into the municipal street system. This road is currently a private road and serves about 8 homes. It has been paved, but the road is not in very good condition. I would anticipate that it will need significant investment within the next 5 years. We have a petition from the property owners seeking the takeover of this road. The road itself runs about 850 linear feet.**
