Homeowner Grant Program

Update

- The Town entered into an agreement last July to participate in Buncombe County's Homeowner Tax relief Grant Program for low-income homeowners.
- Under the program County homeowners that have lived in their home for 5 years and that earned less than 80 % of the median household income in Buncombe County could apply for \$300 in a tax relief grant plus an additional \$200 for Woodfin residents.
- Applications were managed by Buncombe County's Health and Human Services (HHS) Department
- Woodfin had 52 Town recipients receive grants
- Total cost to the Town **\$10,400**
