Woodridge Public Works 2021/22 Snow Season Snapshot



Did you know that the U.S. has warmed by 2.6 degrees since the first Earth Day on April 22, 1970? According to NOAA, weather and climate describe the same thing – the state of the atmosphere – but at different time scales. This is a brief recap of the Woodridge 2021-2022 snow season.

Overall, the Public Works snowplow drivers covered 20,909 miles plowing this winter, approximately the distance from New York City to California going the long way (heading east from the Statue of Liberty and around the earth to the Golden Gate!).

Public Works crews responded to remove snow & ice 13 times this past winter, a drop from the previous winter that resulted in 18 times out.

Because of fewer storms, Woodridge snowplow drivers plowed for 3,118 hours this season compared to 4,020 hours in the winter of 2020/2021.


In the 2021-2022 snow season, Woodridge received 30 inches of snow. The Woodridge area reported only 30 inches of snow this past winter, with the bulk of snow dropping in January and February. The winter of 2020/2021 saw 47 inches of snow.

#### Letter of Notice

The 87th Street construction project between the Costco entrance and Havens Drive is scheduled to begin within the next two weeks.

The project includes widening the intersection of 87th Street at Woodward Avenue, providing right turn lanes and dual left turn lanes in the northbound, eastbound, and westbound directions, with drainage, sidewalk, traffic signal improvements, and resurfacing.

During construction, 87th Street and Woodward Avenue will be reduced to a single lane in each direction plus turn lanes. Access to properties will be maintained throughout construction. When work occurs that will require removal and replacement of existing driveways, properties will be notified in advance.

The project is scheduled to be substantially completed by the end of 2022.

## \$309 Million Assistance Program for Illinois Homeowners Impacted by COVID-19

Governor JB Pritzker and the Illinois Housing Development Authority (IHDA) announced recently that the Illinois Homeowner Assistance Fund (ILHAF) will opened on April 11, 2022, to help homeowners who have fallen behind on mortgage payments and related housing expenses during the COVID-19 pandemic. Eligible households will be able to apply for up to \$30,000 in free assistance to pay past due mortgage payments, property taxes, property insurance, and delinquent homeowner and/or condo association fees.
