



### Village Board approves cannabis dispensary zoning ordinance amendment and cannabis retailers occupation tax

The amendment adds "Cannabis Dispensary" to the list of special uses in non-residential zoning districts and a three percent retailer's tax for cannabis sales

At the July 21 Regular Board Meeting, the Mayor and Board of Trustees approved two ordinances related to adult-use cannabis.

-ORD-2022-41 Cannabis Dispensary Zoning Ordinance Amendment Consideration of an Ordinance that would amend the Zoning Ordinance to add "Cannabis Dispensary" to the list of Special Uses in non-residential zoning districts.

-ORD-2022-42 Adult Use Cannabis Municipal Retailer's Occupation Tax Consideration of an Ordinance that amends the Village Code to enact a three (3) percent Municipal Retailer's Occupation Tax for Recreational/Adult-Use Cannabis sales in the Village.

The following local requirements apply:


-Any part of a building (a.k.a. a tenant space) that is occupied by a Cannabis Dispensary shall be at least one thousand feet (1,000') from the perimeter lot line of any property within the corporate limits of the Village of Woodridge that is used for a school serving students in any grade level between Kindergarten and 12th grade.

-Any part of a building (a.k.a. a tenant space) that is occupied by

a Cannabis Dispensary shall be at least one hundred feet (100') from the perimeter lot line of any property within the corporate limits of the Village of Woodridge that is zoned for or used as a dwelling

-There shall be a maximum of two Cannabis Dispensaries within the corporate limits of the Village of Woodridge.

Potential cannabis dispensaries will undergo a background check and vetting through the Plan Commission.



### **Recap: Zoning Ordinance Open House**

On Monday, July 18, the Village and its consultants, Teska Associates and Ancel & Glink, held an Open House at Village Hall from 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Approximately 10-15 persons attended. The purpose of the Open House was to solicit input from the public concerning the zoning code update in an informal setting. The purpose of the informal format was twofold. First, to allow for one-on-one or small group conversations between the consultants/village staff and the public. Second, it was to obtain input on significant zoning-related policy issues. This was accomplished by setting up four policy area stations where the public could comment on the policies

individually.

Comments were solicited in several ways ranging from conversations to written notes made on the display boards to ranking the importance of policies by affixing colored dots on display boards. The stations/policy areas included:

- Suburban agriculture in residential districts, i.e. bee keeping
- Backyard chickens
- Accessory dwelling units
- Missing middle housing
- Short-term rentals

### Do you have an open pool permit?

It's that time of year: do you have an open pool permit? All pool permits require inspections in order for your pool to be safe for your family and friends. Important information is available at the Permit FAQ website.

#### Pool installations

A permit is required for a pool installation. A plat of survey is needed showing the location of the pool and a line drawn, indicating where the electric and/or gas line will be connected. Specifications on the pool/equipment to be installed should be submitted with the application. The permit application should list all of the

contractors.


# **IDOT** to host virtual meeting on statewide electric vehicle infrastructure

The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) has announced that it will host a virtual public meeting on July 28, at 6:00 p.m., to provide information and receive feedback on the

development of the state's National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Plan.

Comments received at the meeting will help IDOT in developing a statewide plan to create and support an interconnected network of charging stations along key travel corridors. The plan is required in order for Illinois to receive an anticipated \$148 million investment in electric vehicle infrastructure as part of the federal Bipartisan Infrastructure Law passed in 2021. ## SAVE ON YOUR WATER BILL! -CONSERVATION TIPS

Please see these tips on how to conserve water, lower your water bill, and create change for a healthy planet.



### WOODRIDGE ORDINANCES

- Restricted use: starting May 15 through Sept.15 - no watering on consecutive days (Code 7-5B-10)
- No watering during 11 AM 5 PM

### OUTDOOR



- Pay attention to your hose you could lose up to 600 gallons/hour!
- Use a water bucket to wash your vehicle
- Sweep sidewalks instead of rinsing with a hose

### GARDEN & LAWN • Use a watering can

- Water your lawn in the early morning or late evenings
- Avoid over-watering the lawn

## INDOOR

- Turn off the water while you brush or shave
- Select the correct water level for washing clothes
- Avoid long showers

## **OTHER TIPS**

- Consider installing a rain barrel for watering lawn and plants
- Detect leaking toilets using dye tablets or food coloring
