Halloween 2021 Trick-or-Treating Information

We all have one "ghoul" this Halloween on Sunday, Oct. 31: a safe and fun holiday for everyone. Please keep in mind that Woodridge trick-or-treating hours are from 3 p.m. – 7 p.m.

Woodridge understands that there are varying comfort levels about trick-ortreating this year during the pandemic. To help all of our neighbors have a spook-tacular and safe Halloween, the Village recommends:

If your residence is participating in trick or treating: turn on your porch

If your residence is not participating in Trick-or-Treating: turn off your porch light or post the "Please, no Trick-or-Treaters" sign in a visible location. The sign is available on the Woodridge website for download.

The IL Department of Public Health issued updated COVID-19 Guidance for Halloween and Fall Festivities. The guidance says:

Trick-or-treating outdoors in small groups is best, but if outdoors is not an option, there are steps people can take to make indoor trick-or-treating safer. Those handing out tricks or treats indoors should open doors and windows as much as possible to promote increased ventilation and wear a mask. It is also important for everyone handing out or receiving treats to wash their hands.

Alternatives to door-to-door trick-or-treating can include setting up tables in a parking lot or other safe outdoor area where individually wrapped treats can be set out or holding an outdoor costume parade for kids along with a parent/guardian.

LIHEAP Energy Assistance

DuPage County offers a Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) to assist people in need with their utility bills. This program helps people in low-income households pay for home energy services such as natural gas, propane and electric service. Emergency furnace assistance is also available. LIHEAP is accepting applications now through Tuesday, May 31, 2022. Participants must meet specific criteria to qualify.

COVID-19 Pfizer Booster Shots Widely Available across DuPage County

Following the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) endorsement of the CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices' (ACIP) recommendations for a booster dose of the Pfizer – BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine, people who are 65 years and older, residents in long-term care settings, and people aged 50-64 years with underlying medical conditions are eligible for and encouraged to get their booster dose.

In addition, people aged 18-49 years with underlying medical conditions as well as people aged 18-64 years who are at increased risk for COVID-19 exposure and transmission based on their occupational or institutional setting are also eligible to receive a booster shot of Pfizer-BioNTech's COVID-19 vaccine. Booster recommendations only apply to individuals who completed the two-shot series of Pfizer-BioNTech at least 6 months ago. Individuals who received Moderna or Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccines are not currently eligible for boosters and mixing vaccines is not recommended. Link: news releases
