

Woodridge Police Department Supports Safe2Help Illinois Program

In the absence of a trusted adult, Safe2Help Illinois offers students a safe, confidential way in which to share information that might help prevent suicides, bullying, school violence or other threats to school safety. This program is not intended to suspend, expel, or punish students. Rather, the goal is to get students to "Seek Help Before Harm."

Safe2Help Illinois is a 24/7 program where students can use a free app, text/phone, website (Safe2HelpIllinois.com) and other social media platforms to report school safety issues in a confidential environment. As National Bullying Prevention Awareness Month continues this October, remember there is not just one type of person that gets bullied. Bullying doesn't happen only to kids that are "unpopular," it can happen to kids that are smart, funny, well-liked, and seem to have everything going for them.

DuPage County Seeks Public Input on Trail System

The DuPage County Division of Transportation (DuDOT) is seeking input from members of the public as DuDOT staff develop a detailed plan for the County's regional trail network. Those who use the County's trails, including the Illinois Prairie Path, the Great Western Trail, and the Southern DuPage Regional Trail, are asked to share their opinions via a survey at www.dupageco.org/bikeways.

As the DuPage Trails Plan is developed, it will focus on path maintenance and allowable improvements. The Plan's goal is to make trails safer, more accessible, and easier to navigate. The public's input will be used to guide staff as they seek improve the user experience along the trails through wayfinding and creative uses of undeveloped trail property.

Are You Recycling the Right Way :?

SCARCE created this helpful example curbside recycling guide. Some helpful recycling tips:

- Lids on plastics should be reattached after emptying
- Containers labeled with recycling #6 cannot be recycled, which includes Solo cups and Styrofoam
- Some items that do not belong in recycling include juice pouches, tubes (e.g., toothpaste), gift tissue paper, cooking ware
