

Woodridge Facilities Project Update & 75th Street Warehouse

The Village continues to make progress for the Woodridge Police Department and Public Works facilities. Currently, the Police Department is finalizing the building plans and guaranteed maximum price (GMP). GMP helps to control expenses. A guaranteed maximum price is a cap on the amount the client (Woodridge) will have to pay project contractors, regardless of the project's actual cost to the contractor. Woodridge expects the Woodridge Police Department ground-breaking ceremony to occur in the last week in April. For further information, please visit the Woodridge New Facility Needs website.

A high-visibility project due to its location is the new warehouse and office under construction at 2240 75th Street (west of I-355 ramp) on the former Wilton Property. According to the construction company website, "the new facility is designed according to standards representative of a corporate headquarters facility. The building, situated on an 8.14-acre site, will feature 32' building clear height, 14 docks/loading doors (expandable to 20), two drive-in doors, and 177 parking spaces for cars and 11 trailer storage stalls. The building will also feature 2,240 square feet of speculative office space situated at the southeast corner of the building."

Since these two projects – the Police Department/Public Works facility and 75th street warehouse – are located in a similar vicinity, it can be confusing about each project's location. RTA Launches Online Portal for Reduced, Free Ride Permits

The Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) just launched Fare Programs Online, a web-based portal for reduced fare and ride free permits for seniors and customers with disabilities. The portal aims to increase access to these programs. Apply, replace, and renew at Fares.RTAChicago.org.

Pace Launches DuPage Access Program

Branded as the DuPage Access Program, this service provides registeredPace ADA Paratransit passengers a free (up to \$30) alternative option to dedicated paratransit services. Passengers will be able to book immediate or scheduled trips using the Uber app. Additionally, ADA-eligible passengers who don't use a smartphone will be able to take advantage of this program when a reservation-by-phone option is launched in February.

Flashback Friday: 2011 Groundhog Day Blizzard (Jan. 31 -Feb. 2)

Over the three day period, snowfall totaled 21.2 inches officially at Chicago's O'Hare Airport, making it the third largest snowstorm on record for the city of Chicago.
