The 2022-2023 Woodridge Refuse, Recycling, and Yard Waste Program brochure is now available. Residents will receive this new brochure in the mail from Groot by June. The Village of Woodridge would like to remind residents of a few items of note related to Groot refuse collection services, including:

- Yard waste collection began on April 1 and will continue through December 15.
- Refuse and yard waste stickers will incur a ten-cent (\$0.10) increase on the anniversary of the fifth year of the current contract, June 1, 2022. The new cost of a sticker will be \$3.90. Any Groot stickers that have been already purchased will be honored.
- Clean-up week is scheduled for the fall, during the first full week of October on your regularly scheduled pick-up day. In 2022, the clean up week will start on October 3.


The Village has worked closely with the waste collection industry during the past decade to develop and maintain a program that meets the needs of residents and is environmentally responsible.



Do you get health insurance through Medicaid? Pending Medicaid Changes



Don't risk losing your health insurance. To keep your insurance, Illinois Medicaid needs to be able to send you paperwork. Give them an address where mail can always reach you.

The Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS) is taking steps to prepare for the end of the Federal Covid-19 Public Health Emergency

(PHE). When the PHE ends, the federal Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services will end its continuous coverage provision. This provision has allowed HFS to keep Medicaid customers insured without confirming all eligibility requirements. As a result of this continuous eligibility, Medicaid customers have not been asked to update their information for two years. That new information is now critical for their continued coverage.

As the PHE ends, the IL Department of Healthcare and Family Services' goals are to protect coverage for as many people as possible, reduce churn, reduce inequities, fulfill all legal requirements, and meet federally mandated timeframes.

Helping Households Connect: Affordable Connectivity Program

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) provides eligible households with a discount on broadband service and connected devices. This program provides a discount of up to \$30 per month toward the internet for eligible households.

ACP is a U.S. government program run by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) program to help low-income households pay for internet service and connected devices like a laptop or tablet.

You are likely eligible if your household's income is below 200% of the Federal Poverty Line, or if you or someone you live with currently receives a government benefit like SNAP, Medicaid, SSI, WIC, Pell Grant, or Free and Reduced-Price Lunch.

If your household is eligible, you could receive:

- Up to a \$30/month discount on your internet service
- Up to a \$75/month discount if your household is on qualifying Tribal lands
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, tablet, or desktop computer (with a co-payment of more than \$10 but less than \$50)
- A low cost service plan that may be fully covered through the ACP*
