practices. Prepares detailed plan review letters/correspondence to identify deficiencies or approvals.

- Conducts inspections and enforces the Village's building codes, property maintenance code and zoning ordinances for residential, multi-family, commercial, and industrial property.
- Assists with management of Village's residential rental programs.
- Keeps inspection records and prepares reports for permit tracking, permit review and inspection activities.
- Makes independent decisions and exercises independent judgment in the absence of specific policies and/or guidance from superiors but within the limits defined by the supervisors.

Entry-Level Police Officer Recruitment

The Village of Woodridge is seeking applicants to establish an eligibility list for full-time police officers. Hiring will begin immediately from this Eligibility List once it is posted. The starting salary is \$65,000. The application deadline is August 5, 2021 at 4:00 p.m. Candidates are required to attend and/or view the mandatory orientation session. The orientation session will be held virtually and details will be supplied at a later time. Your exam will be offered and proctored electronically, with multiple sessions offered. All testing sessions will be offered during business hours within the week of September 5th – it is your responsibility to ensure you have the flexibility to test during this week and during business hours. 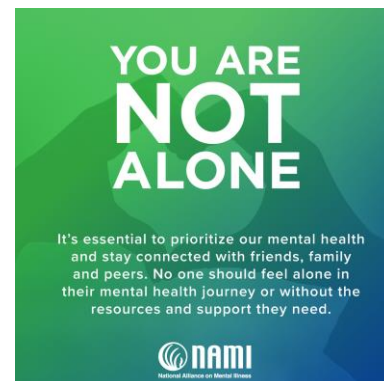
United States Postal Service Delays

Many people across the country, including Woodridge, continue to experience delays in receiving their mail from the United States Postal Service (USPS). Many of the Woodridge delays average approximately three days, and some people experience delays as long as 7-10 days. Congressman Bill Foster's Office is aware of the mail delays, and they are working with the USPS on the issue. The delays are due to USPS staffing shortages, and mail carriers are routinely servicing more than one route in a day but are still behind. Recently, Congressman Foster's Office sent another letter to USPS regarding the mail delays and their new casework process.

If you are experiencing mail delays, please visit [Congressman Foster's website](#) and report the issue. Also, the Village encourages people to sign up for [USPS's Informed Delivery Service](#). Informed Delivery allows you to view greyscale images of the exterior, address side of letter-sized mailpieces, and track packages in one convenient location.

The BOT have the power to supervise, control, regulate and manage the Fire District and to make and enforce all necessary ordinances, and rules and regulations for the proper management of the Fire District. The DuPage County Board Chairman appoints members of the Board of Trustees. Trustees serve three (3) year terms and require reappointment by the County Board Chairman.
