The Village of Woodridge updated Water Bill Payment Portal is now available. Customers that currently use the Payment Portal to view, pay, or autopay their water bill will need to

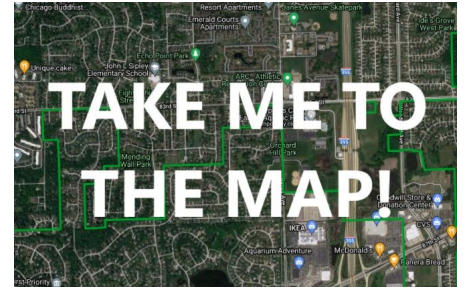
re-register for the service. Please note that the Payment Portal requires the customer numbers and account numbers to enroll. Both of those numbers

Share Your Ideas to Update the Village of Woodridge's Zoning Code!

The Village of Woodridge is updating its zoning ordinance, which was adopted in 1976 and updated in 1991. While amendments have been made occasionally, this is the first comprehensive update. Zoning is the main regulatory tool used by local governments to manage the use and form of development on private property. The ordinance update will happen over the course of one year, with a goal completion date of late 2022.

Yard Waste Collection Begins April 1

Yard waste collection officially resumes on April 1 and continues through December 15.

Residents can dispose of yard waste at the curb on their normal refuse collection day. One sticker is required for every 33 gallon unlined container or yard waste paper bag.

Brush should be packaged in bundles no more than 4 feet in length and 2 feet in diameter. Each bundle must have a yard waste sticker attached and cannot weigh more than 50 pounds.

Residents can also use environmentally friendly alternatives to dispose of yard waste. These options include mulching and composting. Visit DuPage County's website, www.dupageco.org, for information on composting.
