A friendly reminder that Woodridge Watering Restrictions are in effect through September 15. The Village Code states that lawn sprinkling should not occur on consecutive days or between the hours of 11:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

Please note that residents may continue watering newly planted gardens, lawns, trees, shrubs and plants by means of handheld watering devices. New lawns (less than 3 months old) are also exempt from this provision and may continue to be sprinkled.

Fire Hydrant & Valve Exercising Program

The Village of Woodridge Public Works Department will be conducting its annual fire hydrant and valve exercising inspection program through October. This important program allows the Village to exercise its hydrants and main line valves on a regular basis in order to remove any accumulation of sediment and other deposits that exist in the water main.
